A BILL

To provide for the revision of certification requirements for the labeling of certain electronic products under the Energy Star program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "ENERGY STAR Reg-
- 5 ulatory Improvement Act".

1	SEC. 2. THIRD-PARTY CERTIFICATION UNDER ENERGY
2	STAR PROGRAM.
3	Section 324A of the Energy Policy and Conservation
4	Act (42 U.S.C. 6294a) is amended by adding at the end
5	the following:
6	"(e) Third-Party Certification.—
7	"(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2),
8	not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
9	of this subsection, the Administrator shall revise the
10	certification requirements for the labeling of con-
11	sumer, home, and office electronic products for pro-
12	gram partners that have complied with all require-
13	ments of the Energy Star program for a period of
14	at least 18 months.
15	"(2) Administration.—In the case of a pro-
16	gram partner described in paragraph (1), the new
17	requirements under paragraph (1)—
18	"(A) shall not require third-party certifi-
19	cation for a product to be listed; but
20	"(B) may require that test data and other
21	product information be submitted to facilitate
22	product listing and performance verification for
23	a sample of products.
24	"(3) Third parties.—Nothing in this sub-
25	section prevents the Administrator from using third

1	parties in the course of the administration of the
2	Energy Star program.
3	"(4) Termination.—
4	"(A) In general.—Subject to subpara-
5	graph (B), an exemption from third-party cer-
6	tification provided to a program partner under
7	paragraph (1) shall terminate if the program
8	partner is found to have violated program re-
9	quirements with respect to at least 2 separate
10	models during a 2-year period.
11	"(B) Resumption.—A termination for a
12	program partner under subparagraph (A) shall
13	cease if the program partner complies with all
14	Energy Star program requirements for a period
15	of at least 3 years.".
